Writers Exhibition Registration Guidelines

Columbia Center for the Arts (CCA), located in the heart of the Columbia Gorge National Scenic Area, is hosting its fourth annual **Pacific Northwest Plein Air Painting Competition and Writing Exhibition** from August 28 to September 1, 2008. Artists are invited to spend five days visiting some of the most visually remarkable sites in the Gorge and putting their impressions on canvas or paper to share with the public.

The writing portion of the Plein Air show is an open-call event that culminates in publication on the CCA website and a public reading in the CCA theater*. Writing can be prose or poetry (or any combination thereof). **The registration fee is \$15.** Registered participants receive a location map, invitation to the opening reception on August 28, submission and public-reading guidelines, and a "goody bag" of writing-related treats.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is plein air?

En plein air is a French term for painting in the out-of-doors with the goal of capturing a moment—the lighting, the clouds, the mood—as quickly as possible.

How does a writer do this?

While plein air painting is popular across the country, Columbia Center for the Arts is (as far as we can tell) the only organization that includes writers. The idea for writers is essentially the same: capture a moment before it disappears. Of course, writers are not bound to re-create visual portraits of the landscape—the “moment” might involve other people in the area, sounds or conversations overheard, smells and sensations, or even inner thoughts. The goal is to capture a snippet of time as deftly and quickly as possible and paint a picture for others to “see.”

Do I have to be present each day to participate?

It’s the most fun to go to the scheduled venue and join the other writers and painters at work, but it is not a requirement. However, it is a requirement that the piece you submit for publication and/or present at the public reading be something that was created during this year’s plein air event.

Should I revise my pieces before I submit them?

Minimally—while you want to present your best work, you don’t want to lose the in-the-moment-ness with which you wrote it.
